Aqua-Pure is poised to become more than just a "Water Treatment" Company. Our goal is to become a true "**Water Management**" Company. We are working with municipalities such as the City of Weatherford to provide treated sewage to natural gas producers for frac fluid via a pipeline network in lieu of using freshwater. After the water is used for fracs and is contaminated it will be recycled using Aqua-Pure NOMAD technology.

So far the idea is getting positive response:

- ✓ **Municipalities** - Selling treated sewage means a new revenue stream and fewer water trucks on the roads.
- ✓ **Environmental Regulators** - Protecting existing freshwater is a priority.
- ✓ **Public** - People want to see better water management practices.
- ✓ **Gas Producers** - Need water and see the potential for using treated sewage. Pipeline delivery is very attractive.

The "Old" Way

Fresh Water is used to stimulate gas flow. Typical 120,000 barrels used per frac.



Water is hauled both directions (to and from wellsites) using trucks - increased noise, traffic & pollution.



Contaminated wastewater is hauled to a disposal well. No recycling or re-use.



The "Aqua-Pure" Way

Treated municipal sewage is used instead of freshwater.



Water is delivered to gas wells using pipeline network. (no trucks required!)



Contaminated water is returned via pipeline for recycling using NOMAD units.



Recycled water is blended back with sewage from (1) for continuous re-use.



Remember Kermit the frog's immortal words: "*It's not easy being green*". How true! Most companies talk about being "green" and environmentally friendly. When it comes to paying for anything environmental many of these same companies are not so enthusiastic. Aqua-Pure has to walk the line between offering green services and also being economically competitive.

We are doing just that - creating value for our customers while at the same time saving millions of barrels of freshwater from disposal. The ponds at the left show wastewater in the foreground that would otherwise go for disposal and the recycled freshwater in the background that is being re-used instead of taking more freshwater from the environment.

Fountain Quail, our service company in Texas, now employs over 80 people. The Company is growing and the word is spreading throughout the industry that someone is finally offering "green" solutions that make sense!
